What have we been up to this week?

Dosbarth Tysilio — This week in **Dosbarth Tysilio**, we've been busy creating pages for our Superhero class book and listening to *Super Daisy* while exploring opposites and comparisons. In maths, Reception pupils practised sorting objects, while Year 1 and Year 2 worked on number bonds to 10. As part of our superhero topic, we explored colour palettes, designed our own masks using a variety of shapes and patterns, and tested the strength of different materials. In indoor PE, Year 1 and 2 developed rotation skills and created short superhero sequences on the equipment, while Reception focused on balancing skills. To celebrate Owain Glyndŵr Day, the children enjoyed challenges around the classroom, including building a castle and colouring a flag.

Dosbarth Tecla — This week we have been celebrating Owain Glyndŵr the Prince of Wales. Throughout the week we have been incredibly busy completing various tasks across all our areas of learning. We enjoyed sketching the statue of him in Corwen. We used our mapping skills to plot some of the castles he won and lost; as well as creating Owain Glyndŵr banners on Adobe Express. On Wednesday we wrote a class poem all about Owain Glyndŵr. Congratulations to Oilly for winning our Kahoot quiz and a special mention to Charlie and Branwen who came close 2nd and 3rd! In maths this week year 3 have been working on partitioning numbers to 1000, year 4 on partitioning numbers to 10,000, year 5 on partitioning numbers to 1 million and year 6 rounding and integers.
